FACILITIES TO VACCINATED POPULATION

Due to the ongoing surge of COVID-19 cases across the country and President Rodrigo Roa Duterte's directive to restrict the movement of unvaccinated individuals, the following guidelines shall be observed in all CAAP operated facilities and by all air operators:

**Section 1. Scope.** – These guidelines shall apply to all individuals entering CAAP operated facilities whether temporarily, in-transient, or otherwise. Likewise, this shall also apply to domestic passengers traveling to and from the National Capital Region (NCR) via any domestic or foreign air operator.

**Section 2. No Vaccination, No Entry Policy.** – Only fully vaccinated persons will be allowed entry into any CAAP-operated facility upon presentation of (i) physical or digital copies of a Local Government Unit (LGU) – issued vaccine card or a DOH issued vaccine certification, or any IATF-prescribed document, and (ii) a valid government-issued ID with picture and address.

A person is considered fully vaccinated (i) two (2) weeks after their second dose in a two-dose series such as the Pfizer, Moderna, or Sinovac vaccines; or (ii) two (2) weeks after a single-dose vaccine such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen Vaccine.

Further, air operators must require the same documents from their crew and passengers before boarding.

**Section 3. Exceptions.** – The "No Vaccination, No Ride Policy" shall not apply to the following:

- a. Persons with medical conditions that prevent full COVID-19 vaccination, as evidenced by a duly signed medical certificate with name and contact details of the physician; and
- b. Persons who will procure essential goods and services, such as but not limited to food, water, medicine, medical devices, public utilities, energy, work, and medical and dental necessities, as evidenced by a duly issued barangay health pass or other appropriate proof to support and justify such travel.

An individual who falls under any of the exceptions above must present a negative RTPCR result taken within the last forty-eight (48) hours before entry.


**Section 4. Violation.** – Any individual who fails to present the required documents stated above shall be denied entry. Further, a person who shall present any falsified document shall be charged accordingly under relevant laws, rules, and regulations.

Any violation of these rules shall also be ground for suspension or revocation of an air operators' certificate and administrative fine pursuant to Republic Act No. 9497 without prejudice to the filing of administrative, civil, and criminal cases.


**Section 5. Implementation.** – The CAAP Security and Investigation Service (CSIS) shall ensure the compliance of this Memorandum Circular by posting security officers in strategic entry points in CAAP facilities.

**Section 6. Effectivity.** – This Memorandum Circular shall take effect immediately and remain in full force and effect while the COVID-19 alert level in NCR is at Alert Level 3 or higher, as may be determined by the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Disease (IATF).
